Neosporosis in Dogs

WHAT'S HAPPENING

Following up on the article a couple months ago about the dangers of Neosporosis; what are the signs and symptoms in dogs that carry it?



A healthy dog, contracting neosporosis may not have any symptoms and your dog may just be a carrier of the parasite. The illness is usually seen in puppies, who contract the neosporosis from their mother. However, if the condition becomes severe or if your dog is older or has a chronic illness, the symptoms may include a skin rash and ulcers, abortion, pneumonia, and progressive paralysis that leads to death. In addition, neosporosis can damage your dog's liver, causing yellowing of the eyes and skin, swollen abdomen, fever, and a general ill feeling. Early treatment can be life-saving so do not delay in taking your dog to the veterinarian's office if you suspect he has this condition.

Symptoms of Neosporosis in Dogs

Some dogs with neosporosis can be carriers and have no symptoms at all but most have at least a few of these common signs:

Dermatitis

Ulcers in the skin

Abortion in pregnant females

Damage to the liver

Respiratory infections such as bronchitis and pneumonia

If the infestation is severe, damage to the central nervous system can create complications such as:

Walking in circles

Abnormal behavior

Slowed reflexes Confusion

Weak muscles

Muscle inflammation

Trembling or shaking

Vision trouble including blurriness or even blindness

Paralysis of the legs Difficulty swallowing

Neospora caninum is the most common type of neosporosis that affects many species such as dogs, horses, cattle, and sheep. Neospora hughesi is a relatively new form of neospo-

rosis that has only been known to affect horses so far.

Keeping those who use our roads safe is a year-round priority and enforcing the law around these issues takes place locally across Herefordshire, Shropshire and Worcestershire 24/7, with road safety sitting at the heart of Police and Crime



Commissioner John Campion's Safer West Mercia Plan.

Throughout July the National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) will be focusing on 'Operation Spotlight'. The national operation will recognise the significant contributory factor these issues have in road traffic collisions and will highlight the work that we do every day to tackle these.

Speeding, as well as inappropriate speed, can have a devastating impact on the safety of road users, increasing the risk of a collision and the severity of the consequences. If prosecuted for speeding, the minimum penalty is a £100 fine and 3 penalty points.

Everyone knows it's illegal to use a hand held mobile behind the wheel and motorists caught face a £200 fine and six points on their licence. Drivers caught twice face a lengthy ban — which could also lead to a £1,000 fine. While new drivers - those who have passed within the last two years - face having their licence revoked if caught just once. New legislation also makes it clearer that the law includes using phones for reasons such as internet use, checking notifications and uploading content whilst driving.

There is no fool-proof way of calculating how much alcohol you can drink and remain under the limit, or knowing how much an individual person can drink and still drive safely. There is also no way of knowing how long certain drugs

can stay in your system. If caught whilst driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs you risk an unlimited fine, losing your licence and a possible prison sentence.

Seatbelt use is such a significant contributory factor with regards to road collisions and the resulting injuries. In the UK it is a legal requirement for drivers and passengers to wear a seatbelt, unless they have an exemption and it is the driver's legal responsibility to ensure that any passenger under 14 years old is using the appropriate child restraint.

The operation will also raise awareness of the issues faced by cyclists and motorcycle riders on the roads, along with the impact of HGV use and will also highlight some of the ways we are now tackling these issues to support our day to day enforcement. Supt Stu Bill said: "Everyone knows the rules around seatbelts, drink/drug driving and mobile phones and the importance of sticking to the speed limit and we are very clear that when you get behind the wheel it is your responsibility to stay focused and alert. The majority of drivers use the roads respectfully and adhere to the law but it is concerning that we still have some drivers across our area who are willing to risk it. Enforcing the law across our roads is a year round commitment for us to challenge this behaviour".

Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion said: "We are seeing too much harm being caused on our roads, and in most cases, it is completely avoidable. As PCC, I continue to ensure West Mercia Police has the resources it needs to put road safety at the heart of its work across the three counties. Operation Spotlight will be another opportunity to highlight the year-round focus to raise awareness of the 'Fatal Four' and enforce the law against those willing to putting themselves and others at risk."
